

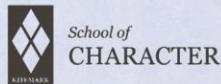

Dear Year 11 Parents and Carers

As we all know, year 11 is a really important time for students. It is a time for all of their hard work to finally come to fruition and for them to consider their next steps.

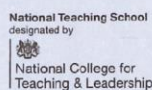
At the end of year 10 your child attended an assembly where I explained what to expect from their careers interview with me in year 11. They were asked to consider their skills and qualities and to research what they might like to do once year 11 has finished. This preparation will make for a far more effective use of time during their upcoming careers interview with me. They will be reminded of this in year 11 too.

We are aware that parents and carers play a key part in helping our year 11's make their future plans, so I thought it would be helpful for parents to have a better idea of what we talk about in year 11 when it comes to careers information and guidance.

Applying for post 16 options (College, 6th Form, Apprenticeships) - The Kent Choices website <https://www.kentprospectus.co.uk/> will be your main resource when researching and applying to post 16 options for your child. This is where your child can search and apply for any future provider; 6th Form, college, apprenticeships and supported internships. I will be giving year 11 students their log in details in November so they can make their application but you can use the search function on the site now without having to log in. Just be aware that not all providers have uploaded their offer for next year yet. You can search, filter and use the map function to find courses and providers that are most suitable for your child. We would advise that your child makes their application(s) before the end of January 2022. Please be aware that different institutions have different deadlines for applications to be in. Sixth Form providers are usually the most stringent here so if you would like to go to a Sixth Form, please check with the institution to ensure you know the deadline. It is wise for your child to apply to more than one institution so they have a back-up plan in case they change their mind over the course of the year, or they do not achieve the necessary grades to be accepted for their first choice. Please find attached a word document named "Options Choices Information" for further guidance on Post 16 options. Once your child has applied they will be offered an interview by the institution. This can feel daunting for some. Please reassure your child that this will be good practice for the future and please find attached some guidance that will help them to be prepared, this is a word document named "Interview Advice".

Short term goals – now is the time for you and your child to look into their options for year 12. Help them to understand the different options and talk to them about why each option may or may not suit them as an individual. A few things to consider when having these conversations are; the GCSE results they are likely to get, pursuing subjects they enjoy,





travel plans to and from their future provider and do they need to continue a subject at a higher level because of their future goals?

Long term goals - some students will have a very specific idea of what they would like to do in the future, some will have no idea at all and there will be others who may have an idea of the industry they wish to pursue but not the specific job role. Please let me reassure you that wherever they are on this spectrum is fine. I have included some links below and recommend that your son/daughter takes time to navigate their way around these sites and explore various career paths. It is important for them to look outside the box and discover the variety of jobs out there and not just focus on the ones they already know about. Research will open their eyes to the many opportunities that are available to them.

Helpful information - as you will see, I have included lots of links in this email – Please use them together with your children as you see fit. Some will be more relevant to you than others. I have offered a variety so you can choose which most suit your individual needs. Your child will find all these links and more on the “Careers” section on Teams. I also email all of these links and more to your child’s school email address. However I know that this information can sometimes be “lost” amongst all the other material on offer so we have decided to set up a new Malling School Facebook page dedicated to our careers content. It is called “Future You – The Malling School”. I will be sharing lots of helpful content here so it would be great if you could follow us and keep updated easily.
