How Gritty is your child? This week we have been looking at how gritty the pupils are, we have discussed this in terms of passion and perseverance for a long-term goal. The pupils have completed a grid of questions, rating their answers. With questions starting from "new ideas and projects distract me from previous ones" to "I have overcome setbacks to conquer an important challenge"

WHY DO WE DO THIS?

By asking the pupils to reflect on themselves and how motivated they can remain with any one task supports them in understanding what they need to do to improve their perseverance.

Discuss with your son or daughter what their Grit score was. The range is from 1 to 5, with 5 being very gritty and 1 not at all gritty. Ask them if there was one area in particular that when they thought about it they were surprised at their attitude towards it, for instance do they set one goal and then very quickly change that goal for a variety of reasons.
