Studying for English Exams

Students gain two separate qualifications in English, one GCSE in English Language and one GCSE in English Literature, however preparing for them involves slightly different approaches. In addition, students take a Speaking and Listening exam. If your child has not completed theirs, please ask them to see Mrs Curley. A reminder to students is that their English teachers want them to do their best, so please encourage your child to speak to their teacher if they need extra support or advice.

How to prepare for GCSE English Literature exams

The texts that TMS students have studied for their English Literature course are:

- ♦ An Inspector Calls
- ♦ Romeo and Juliet
- A Christmas Carol
- Poetry Anthology

The exam board will be looking for excellent **knowledge and understanding** of the texts studied. To revise, students should create flashcards, breaking down the plot into chapters or scenes. They should write notes on the characters and the concepts.

Students have been taught strategies for answering each question - including what to say in their introduction. They should practise using these strategies during timed planned practice.

Students also need to write about writer's **methods**. To do this, students need to revise the terminology from their Knowledge Organisers, making sure they understand why writers use them (what effect they want to create).

Students must demonstrate their understanding of **context**: the writer's intention and message. Writers want to teach, tell or celebrate something with the reader and students should reflect this in their answers.

In the Revision Resources, there are practice questions (also available outside R18). Teachers will be happy to mark these for the students.

How to prepare for GCSE English Language exams

In English language exams, students are assessed on their analysis of unseen fiction and non-fiction texts, as well as their own writing.

Students should ensure they know what is expected for both papers. They should plan and practise **Creative Writing** questions and **Non-Fiction Writing** questions, using the correct strategy taught in class. When completing planned practice questions, students should time themselves as good practice for the exams. We recommend that students make flashcards to help them learn everything they need.
