English

English makes students interesting and interested in the world around them. We explore incredible pieces of Literature that explore a number of important themes such as hubris, racism and social responsibility. English Language also allows students to develop the skills they need in order to be eloquent speakers and writers.



Maths

Maths offers pupils the chance to explore why the world around them looks as it does, to make connections between the learning in the classroom and life beyond. By tackling mathematical problems they are developing problem solving skills which is an essential life skill for their future success no matter where life may lead.



Science

Science offers students an opportunity to develop a deep understanding of the physical world.

By learning about the scientific method, a process of analysing empirical evidence, logical thinking and peer review to new problems; students are equipped with the tools to move into further education and employment with success.



Physical Education

PE encourages a positive approach to physical and mental health, wellbeing and a generally active and healthy lifestyle. Students are encouraged to participate, enjoy and achieve, but high performance is also celebrated. Through PE students develop a lifelong love of being active.





PSHE

Personal, social and health education helps students become responsible, well-intentioned and socially aware global citizens. You will be aware of important local and global issues as well as becoming principled and critically thinking individuals.

 Good GCSE grades in a range of subjects will get you into anywhere (TMS Sixth Form, College, other training)


Choose subjects based on interests, skills and strengths;
