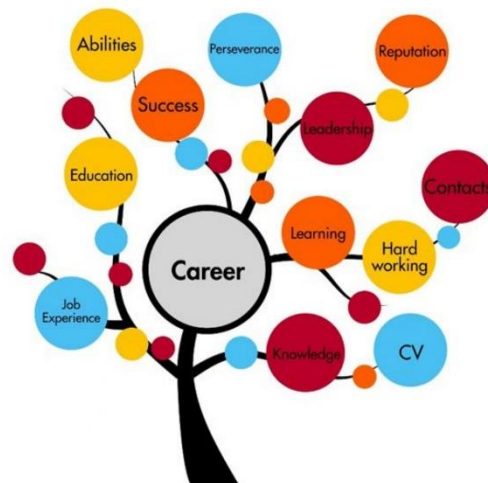
Exciting Future Ahead – Keep Pushing for Success!
