Dear Parent/Carer,

I am writing to share details of the upcoming Easter holiday revision sessions available to our Year 11 students. These sessions provide a valuable opportunity for students to revisit key topics, strengthen their understanding, and build confidence ahead of their GCSE exams.

Students are not required to wear school uniform; however, they should bring a packed lunch if they are staying for the full day. To ensure all students get the most out of the sessions, we expect them to arrive on time, fully equipped, and ready to learn. Please note that mobile phones and headphones are not permitted during lessons in order to help maintain focus. As always, our SWAT expectations will remain in place to support a productive learning environment.

It is vital that students continue revising during the holiday period to remain well prepared. We recommend that students aim for at least four hours of revision each day, using the strategies and techniques they have been taught in lessons and P1 sessions. Wherever possible, we strongly encourage students to attend the in-school revision sessions. Previous Year 11 students have found these extremely beneficial and have credited them with helping to improve both their confidence and their performance.
