


Revision Strategy: Missions & Medals

As your child continues their GCSE journey this year, developing a positive and proactive mindset is key to success. One of the approaches we focus on in period one is "Missions and Medals", a simple but powerful strategy that blends goal setting with positive reinforcement to help students stay motivated and reflective.

Before the half-term break, all Year 11 students planned a personalised revision timetable, identifying the subjects and topics they most needed to focus on. In this week's period one session, they reviewed how well their plans worked, recognising what they were successful with and what didn't go quite as intended. From this reflection, each student has now set a new "Mission" and "Medal" for the week ahead.

- Missions are short, focused goals designed to build good habits and momentum. For example:
 "Complete three past paper questions on algebra and mark them by Friday," or "Stick to my revision timetable for seven days."
 These clear, achievable goals give students a sense of direction and accomplishment.
- Medals are the rewards that celebrate effort and progress — no matter how small. These could be as simple as choosing what's for dinner, enjoying a favourite treat, or having a break to watch a film once the goal is achieved.



This approach encourages students to take ownership of their learning, reflect on their progress, and maintain motivation through small wins. By regularly setting and reviewing their Missions and Medals, your child can build the resilience and consistency that underpin exam success.

What can you do?

You can support at home by asking your child:

- What is your Mission and Medal for this week?
- What worked (or didn't) in your last revision plan?
- How can you celebrate your progress this weekend?

Together, we can help ensure that each step towards the GCSEs feels achievable, rewarding, and purposeful.
