1. Aims

This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for school uniform
- Ensure compliance with the statutory guidance under the Education (Guidance about Costs of School Uniforms) Act 2021, including minimising branded items and maximising value for money

2. Our school's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

The Equality Act 2010 prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

To avoid discrimination, our school will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform costs the same for all pupils
- Allow all pupils to have long hair, though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back
- Allow all pupils to style their hair in the way that is appropriate for school yet makes them feel most comfortable
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Consider reasonable adjustments for pupils with additional needs, including sensory sensitivities, disabilities or medical conditions
- Ensure that any restrictions on appearance, such as hair, jewellery and makeup, are proportionate, reasonable and applied consistently to avoid indirect discrimination
- Allow for adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality by asking pupils or their parents to get in touch with Michelle Hercock, Business Manager, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory guidance from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.

We understand that items with distinctive characteristics, such as branded items or items that have to have a school logo or a unique fabric, colour or design, cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and that requiring many such items limits parents' ability to shop around for a low price.

We will make sure our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

We will do this by:

- Carefully considering whether any items with distinctive characteristics are necessary
- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible
- Considering cheaper alternatives to school-branded items, such as logos that can be ironed on, as long as this does not compromise quality and durability
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-school days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum, so that the school's uniform can act as a social leveller
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year, class or house groups
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for extra-curricular activities
- Considering alternative methods for signalling differences in groups for interschool competitions, such as creating posters or labels
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy
- Ensuring uniform items can be purchased from a range of retailers wherever possible and are not restricted to a single supplier unnecessarily
- Where a specific supplier is named, the school will regularly review value for money and tender contracts at least every 5 years

4. Expectations for school uniform

4.1 Our school uniform

What is not permitted:

- Cardigans are not allowed instead of jumpers
- No jewellery may be worn except a wristwatch and one pair of plain ear studs
- Piercings, other than one in each earlobe, are not allowed
- Trainers are not to be worn with school uniform at any time
- Discreet makeup may be worn in the upper school only
- False nails and coloured nail varnish are not allowed
- Hair colour must be natural
- Baseball caps are not to be worn with school uniform at any time
- Hooded tops are not to be worn with school uniform at any time
- All appearance expectations will be applied consistently and reasonably, taking into account individual circumstances and equality considerations

4.2 Where to purchase it

Parents/carers are not required to purchase uniform from the named supplier if suitable alternatives meeting the school's specification are available elsewhere, unless the item is a required branded item.

Non-school specific items can be purchased at various supermarkets and clothes stores.

The school also holds a stock of second-hand uniform which is made available to parents on request and also at open days. Donations of uniform are gratefully received at any time during the school year.

5. Expectations for our school community

5.1 Pupils

Pupils are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times, other than specified non-school uniform days, while:

- On the school premises
- Travelling to and from school
- At out-of-school events or on trips that are organised by the school, or where they are representing the school, if required

Pupils may request adjustments to the uniform for reasons including protected characteristics, medical needs, or sensory needs.

Pupils are also expected to contact Mrs Hercock – Business Manager if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

5.2 Parents and carers

Parents and carers are expected to make sure their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name
- In good condition

Parents are also expected to contact Mrs Hercock if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

Parents are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the school uniform in a timely and reasonable manner.

Disputes about the cost of the school uniform will be resolved locally and dealt with in accordance with our school's complaints policy.

Parents may raise concerns about affordability, and the school will work proactively to support access to uniform, including second-hand options.

The school will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome.

5.3 Staff

Staff will closely monitor pupils to make sure they are in correct uniform. They will give any pupils and families breaching the uniform policy the opportunity to comply, but will follow up with the headteacher if the situation does not improve.

Ongoing breaches of our uniform policy will be dealt with by the school behaviour policy.

Staff will take a proportionate and supportive approach to enforcement, particularly where breaches may relate to cost, wellbeing, or equality considerations.

In cases where it is suspected that financial hardship has resulted in a pupil not complying with this uniform policy, staff will take a mindful and considerate approach to resolving the situation.

5.4 Governors

The governing board will review this policy and make sure that it:

- Is appropriate for our school's context
- Is implemented fairly across the school
- Takes into account the views of parents and pupils
- Offers a uniform that is appropriate, practical and safe for all pupils
- Complies fully with statutory guidance on school uniform costs, including demonstrating how the school secures best value for money

The board will also make sure that the school's uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money, for example by avoiding single supplier contracts and by re-tendering contracts at least every 5 years.

6. Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed every two years and sooner if required in response to changes in guidance, concerns about cost, or feedback from parents and pupils. At every review, it will be approved by the full Governing Body.
